His talents were many: he was an artist and an athlete, a dancer and a gardener, a teacher and a disciple. He was a member of St. Anne's Catholic Church where he served as lector. For years he taught the confirmation class at St. Anthony's, sharing Christ's love with dozens of children.

He was an Eagle Scout, an astronomer and a formidable chess opponent. He knew just how to tell a joke --- And when! He nurtured his love of dinosaurs into adulthood. Foremost, he never forgot how to play or to see the world through a child's eyes.
